On March 15th, 2015, 8 brave volunteers made their way through the undergrowth at exhibit area in Zilker Botanical Gardens to survey existing trees. These trees have a diameter of at least 8 inches and will be kept in place in the exhibit area. The location of the large trees were triangulated and circumferences and species noted. At least 50 trees were surveyed and measured throughout the area and at least five different species were identified. Their locations have been mapped out. This information will assist in the determination of future buildings, fence lines, and potential shade trees for bonsai trees on display.

Future home: Zilker Botanical Gardens Austin Parks & Rec Dept. meeting

On the morning of July 31st, TTSBE board members Joey McCoy, Alisan Clarke, Elaine White, & Nan Jenkins were joined by Lynn Haxton (providing survey and CAD expertise) and Joe Yura (head of *Zilker Horticultural Committee*) in the first meeting with the ***Austin Parks and Recreation Dept (PARD)*** representatives to go over the plans to put in the Bonsai exhibit at the Botanical Gardens in the heart of Austin.

We brought a prepared bonsai, a Boxwood donated by Greg Setter, as well as photos of many of our exhibit trees (taken by talented photographer and board member May Lau), and gave the members a brief history of bonsai and why it is important to the local community as well as the entire state. We talked about the number of trees currently in the collection as well as future projections.

Lynn and Alisan showed and explained the work we have done at the site already to get to this point in large poster sized prints: the rainwater study, the tree survey, topography, and a proposed garden plan with buildings and trails.

Nan passed around folders prepared for the meeting with the site map as well as photos of possible structures including a docent house, greenhouse and workhouse, and showed examples of bonsai benches and poles.

Joe Yura spoke about how our group has the support of the committees at ***Zilker*** and fielded questions about us being in the garden. He spoke about how our project fits with the area and esthetics of ***Zilker***.

The next step is for us to get together practical numbers for the ***PARD*** members for a meeting in 2 weeks where we will all walk the site and discuss it on the ground. They want to be on the property and see our vision.

In all the ***Austin PARD*** team seemed genuinely intrigued and happy with our proposal and we are taking steps to meet the application process. There are still many steps ahead, but we are getting there!



Message from the TTSBE Chair

Our shift from planning the exhibit at the property at **Mustang Ridge** to building it in the **Zilker Botanical Gardens** in the heart of Austin has been quick, but has required lots of planning and prep. Here is a time-line on how it all came about:

- **May 2014.** Plans were put on hold at the **Mustang Ridge** site after experiencing 2-3 floods that surpassed the 100 year floodplain, costs of construction on the site skyrocketed and we fell into a quagmire of problems with our Permitting.
- **June 2014.** TTSBE Board decided to explore other options and began looking to other sites including the **Zilker Botanical Garden**.
- **October 2014.** We met with the **Zilker Horticultural Committee** for the first time and presented our proposal for a bonsai garden in a section next to the **Taniguchi Japanese Gardens**.
- **January 2015.** Kathy Shaner was brought to walk the site with board members and she gave pointers on designing a bonsai exhibit in the space.
- **April 2015.** The **Zilker Horticultural Board** approved our project and we received a signed Letter of Intent from the Chair.
- **June 2015.** Sale negotiations of the **Mustang Ridge** land began.
- **July 2015.** First meeting with **Austin Parks and Recreation Department (PARD)** to propose building the bonsai exhibit at the Botanical Gardens.
- **August 2015.** We closed on the sale of the **Mustang Ridge** land, with the final payments coming to **TTSBE** in the following year.
- **August 21 2015.** TTSBE walked through the site at **Zilker** with **PARD** staff and **Zilker** leadership (who are all excited to see this project a reality).
- **September 2, 2015.** TTSBE met with Austin PARD representatives to go over the cost estimates and talk about unplanned expenses. PARD will research the availability and cost of utilities to the area for TTSBE.

We are following all the steps which makes this a long-term and permanent project in our public garden. The job of narrowing down the financial and budgetary numbers are being worked on and we have more meetings with city **PARD** staff coming up.

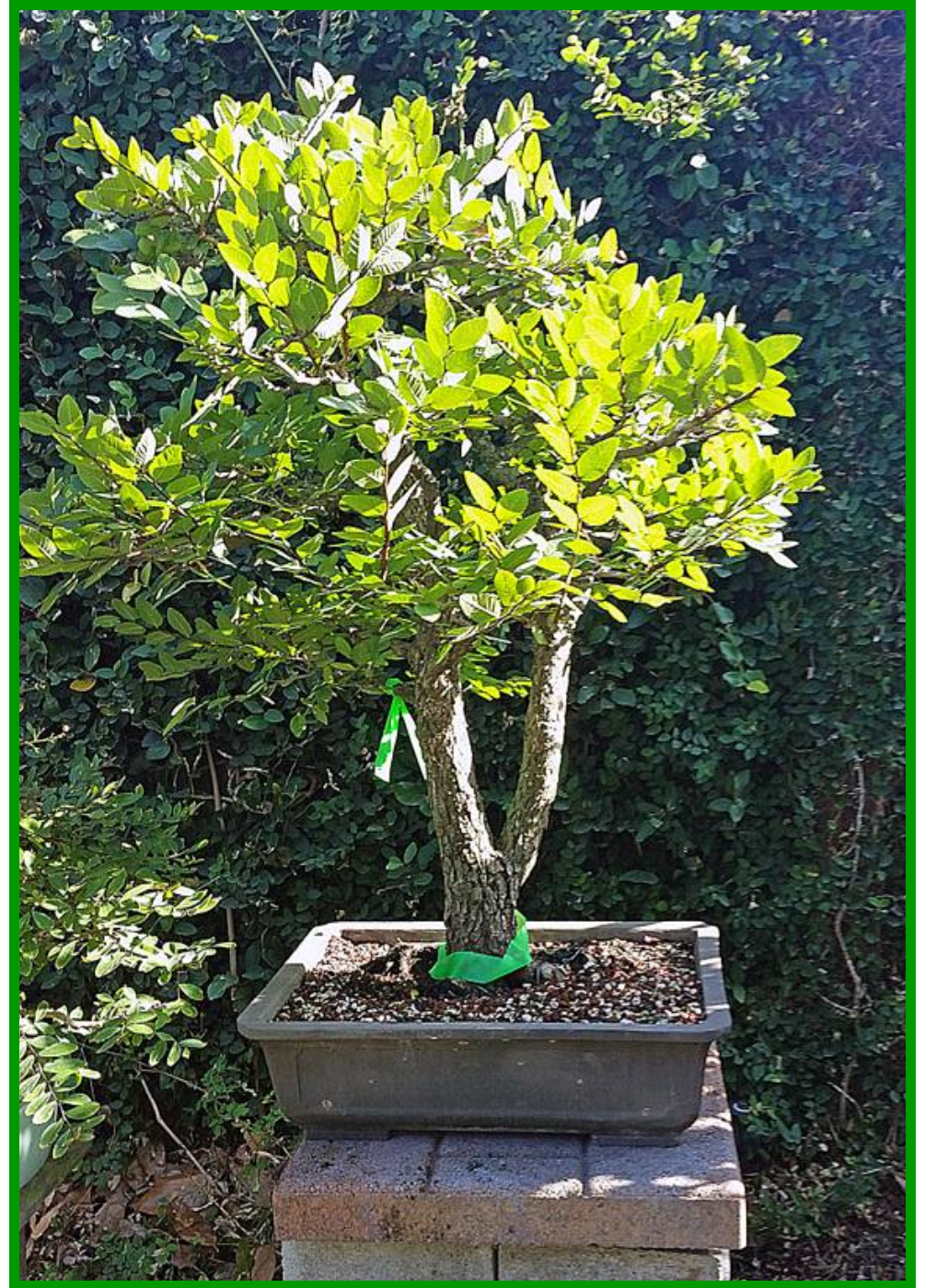
